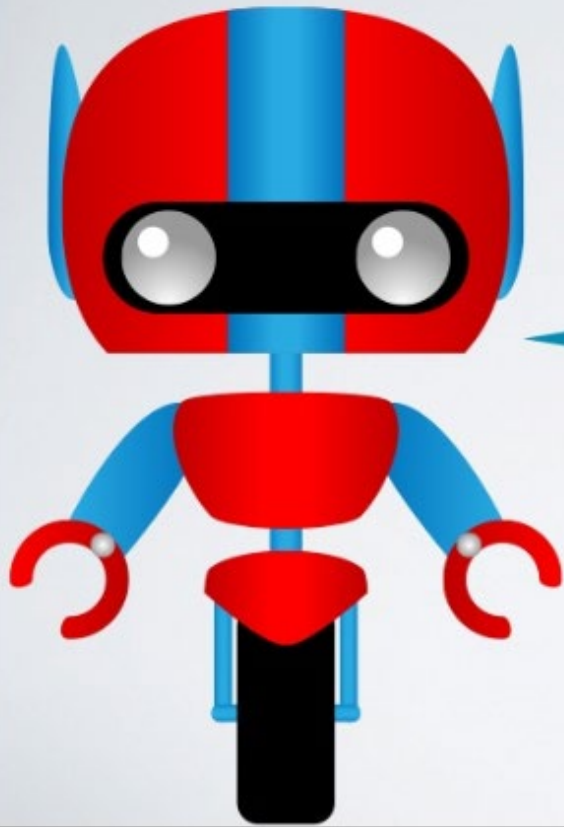

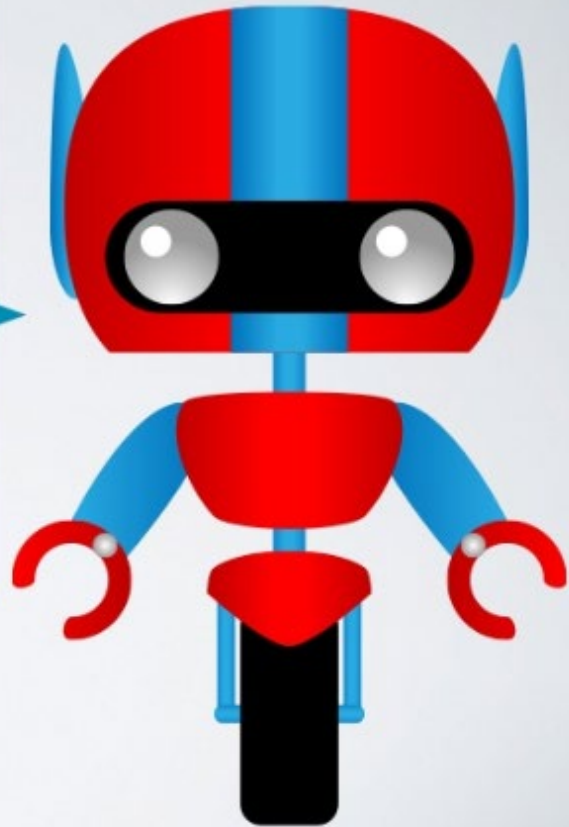

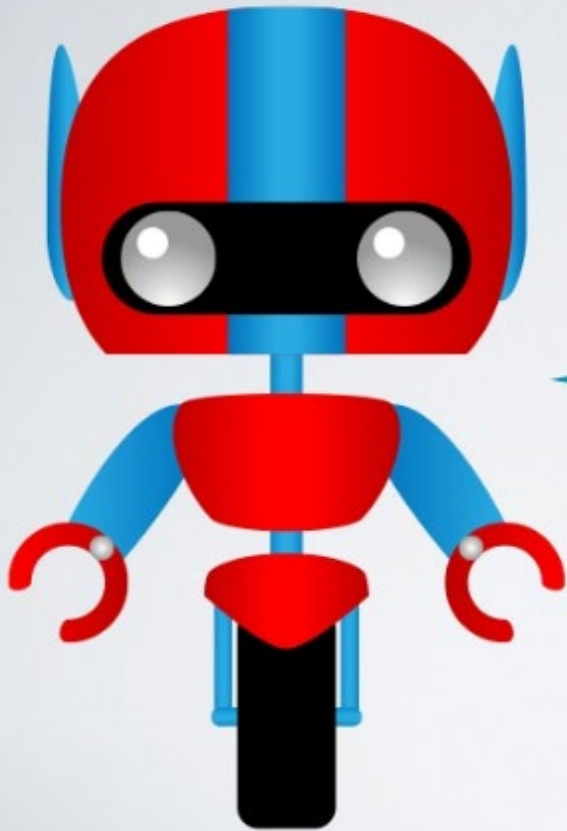

5. Date of publication
